

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the 1980 Census contains a serious undercount of the population of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the 1980 Census contains misinformation and under estimates of tribal poverty levels and unemployment rates, and

WHEREAS, these inaccuracies in the 1980 Census will result in underfunding in entitlement programs such as CETA and will put the Tribe at a disadvantage in competitive grant situations such as EDA grants and HUD Community Development Block Grants.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the inaccurate data in the 1980 Census be officially protested through the State Census Office and U. S. Bureau of the Census.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Ms. Linda Toni, CETA Director, be directed to pursue a program of re-census of the total population of the reservation using CETA carryover funding and also pursue acceptance of the new census figures by State and Federal Agencies.

The foregoing resolution was on August 03, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
