## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there are no veterinary services locally available on the White Mountain Apache Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there is a considerable number of animals on the reservation including livestock of the Tribal Herd and Livestock Associations and other domestic animals that require veterinary services, and
- WHEREAS, there is a need for training for tribal employees involved in livestock management and range resources, and
- WHEREAS, there is a need for a permanent animal clinic facility and a community animal control program.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a P.L. 93-638 contract be submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs to utilize Bureau of Indian Affairs Agriculture Extension funds in the amount of \$45,000.00 in FY 83 monies and \$30,000.00 in FY 84 monies to establish veterinary services and an animal control program on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on August 03, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
