RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Edith Bourke, a senior citizen and a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has come before the Tribal Council with a request for a Home Improvement Program House to be constructed for her in an area west of the State Highway near the Baptist Church known as the North townsite, Whiteriver area, on a lot that has recently been assigned to her, and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Bourke is a widow and explains to the Tribal Council that she does have a homestead below the Baptist Church, but that no electricity is available to that home because of the prohibitive cost involved in the installation of an electricial line to the home, and
- WHEREAS, because of her advanced age, it is necessary for her to have the convenience of electricity and a home located where electricity is readily available without great cost of installation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is in agreement with Mrs. Bourke and approves her request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Home Improvement Program Housing Director place Edith Bourke's name on the priority list to receive a Home Improvement Program home on the lot assigned to her in the area and west of the State Highway near the Baptist Church known as the North Townsite, town of Whiteriver.

The foregoing resolution was on September 07, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
