## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to the delivery of quality mental health services for its tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is in need of the continuation of such services as have been provided by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638) provides for the Department of Health and Human Services, through the U.S. Indian Health Service, to enter into contracts with tribes to provide such services, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it should enter into a 93-638 Contract with the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service in order to continue mental health services on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it request from the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service Office, a P.L. 93-638 Contract beginning on October 01,1983 through June 30, 1984 providing for four (4) staff positions and operational costs for the provision of Mental Health Services. The amount of the request is \$95,275.00.

The foregoing resolution was on September 07, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
