## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Head Start Program is a comprehensive, family oriented child development program, and
- WHEREAS, since its establishment in May, 1965, Head Start has provided comprehensive health, education, nutritional, and social services to more than three thousand (3,000) White Mountain Apache children locally and more than eight million preschool children and families nationally, and
- WHEREAS, major research findings document the Heat Start Programs lasting and positive effects on children, and
- WHEREAS, October has been designated as Head Start Awareness Month and the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program will join more than 8,000 Head Start Centers across the country in celebrating the accomplishments of Head Start, and
- WHEREAS, the support of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its communities have made possible the local Head Start Program.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby proclaim October 24 thru 31, 1983 as the WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE HEAD START WEEK in honor of that program's invaluable contributions to our most precious resource—our children.

The foregoing resolution was on October 19, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against and 1 abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to its authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
