FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, Ivora (Bush) Keys has come before the Tribal Council with a request that the HIP home that had been formerly assigned to her mother Edna Bush, now deceased, be transferred to her as the owner and bases her request on her great need for a home; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council after discussion concludes that it would be fair and equitable to assign the home to Ivora (Bush) Keys and that she is very deserving of a home and further that it is only right that her deceased mother's home be assigned to her for familial reasons as well as justifiable need.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby transfers ownership of the HIP home formerly assigned to Edna Bush, now deceased, to her daughter, Ivora (Bush) Keys.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Chairman to execute any and all documents necessary to accomplish the transfer of this home to Mrs. Keys.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1983, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
