RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Rubert Lupe has come before the Tribal Council with a request for an assignment of land located near the northeast boundary of Fort Apache, south of the Tribal Fairgrounds for purposes of eventually building a home for his family; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises Rubert Lupe that he should make an application to the Tribal Land Board to insure that there is no conflict with previous claimants and to insure that he will have an unencumbered right and title to the land assignment.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves Rubert Lupe's request and advises him to immediately obtain and fill out an application for the land assignment he desires for himself and his family from the Land Board.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1983, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h,i,m) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
