

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, through Resolution No. 83-303, modified the Tribal Travel Regulation (TTR) for the purpose of providing elected/appointed Tribal officials with certain exemptions from the TTR, primarily in the interest of relieving them of detailed reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 83-303 was broadly written to include personnel within the Tribal Executive Office who are neither elected nor appointed.

BE IT RESOLVED that the term "Executive Officers", as used in Resolution No. 83-303 is hereby defined to encompass only elected/appointed Tribal officials and does not include staff personnel supporting these Executive Officers; "appointed" officials being those selected by Council action in accordance with the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws.

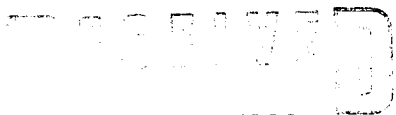
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby amends Resolution No. 83-303, as follows:

1. Only the following elected/appointed officials are covered by the exemptions of the Resolution:

Tribal Chairman
Tribal Vice Chairman
Tribal Council Members
Tribal Secretary
Tribal Treasurer

2. All other personnel enumerated therein are hereby excluded, specifically staff persons; and
3. Council persons when travelling as employees of departments/enterprises/programs are not covered by the exemptions enumerated in Resolution No. 83-303.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1983, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


