

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for the permanent assignment of one or more police officers to the McNary area so as to maintain law and order for the community; and

WHEREAS, available Tribal housing in McNary is not adequate for the officers' requirements in either space or quality; and

WHEREAS, there is a house for sale that will fully satisfy all requirements at a price well below the appraised value of \$16,000, having been offered at \$13,000; said house at #25 Pine Street owned free and clear by Joan Eaves; and

WHEREAS, there is an insurance claim of \$11,786.30 in process, payable to the Tribe for the loss of a police department radio console in a recent thunderstorm; said radio console presently in process of being replaced by the BIA at no cost to the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, it will be advantageous to use the insurance proceeds for purchase of housing, as outlined above, without adding to the outflow of Tribal capital funds, thereby avoiding a capital budget amendment.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the use of the insurance proceeds, as outlined above, for purchase of House #25 Pine Street, McNary, from Joan Eaves, present owner, for a sum not to exceed the total of \$11,786.30; title to be transferred to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1983, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
