

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Precinct Boundary Change And Endorsement Of A Five
District Basis Of Representation For Navajo County

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has determined that a minor boundary change in the Navajo County Pinetop Precinct No. One and Two would enhance tribal community participation in the democratic electoral process; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe agrees with the proposal to increase the number of Navajo County supervisorial districts from three to five to provide a more equitable basis with representation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe encourages tribal members to participate in the democratic electoral process and maintain their voting rights.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, requests the Navajo County Board of Supervisors to make such changes as necessary to create a new Hondah Precinct utilizing the Reservation boundary as its northern limit and coinciding with the existing boundaries of the Pinetop precincts as they currently extend on Reservation lands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that it endorses a proposal to increase the number of Navajo County supervisorial districts from three to five.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1983, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (a,i,s,t,u) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
