## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by management from the Apache Sunrise Ski Area that a former non-member employee of the Ski Area by the name of Greg Miller has been implemented in the burglary of more than \$100,000.00 from the Ski Area safe approximately two years ago, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Greg Miller has been allowed to go unpunished by being granted immunity from federal prosecution by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the U. S. Attorney's Office in order to obtain his testimony against other persons who have committed other felony crimes off the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that none of the money stolen from the Sunrise Ski Area as a direct result of Greq Miller's participation in the burglary has been recovered, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that Greg Miller has been seen by the Sunrise management participating in ski activities at the Sunrise Ski Area, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache tribe concludes that Greg Miller, because of the felonious crimes committed against the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is an undesirable person and is not welcome within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and; therefore, should be excluded from the reservation forever.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Chairman to file a petition through the Tribal Attorney for the permanent exclusion and removal of Greg Miller from within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Trib-1 Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it further directs the Tribal Attorney to investigate any legal remedies available to recover monies stolen from the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Greg Miller as a result of a burglary two years ago at the Sunrise Ski Area.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i & q) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
