RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to quality judicial services for the youths of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the future of the Tribe depends on the healthy development of the youths of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes the problems associated with placing juvenile offenders in the adult jail, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe further recognizes the particularly acute problem of truancy among the youths of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, provides for the adjustment of contracted monies through the Band Analysis.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Youth Service Center be considered by the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the forthcoming Band Analysis, to receive a portion of the contracted monies to facilitate the removal of youths from the adult jail and for the enforcement of the Tribal Compulsory Education (Traicy) Ordinance.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
