

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Ms. Hedy Beatty, Director of the Tribal Health Authority, has come before the Tribal Council to explain the goals of the Health Education Curriculum Project sponsored by the Tribal Health Authority, and

WHEREAS, the goals of the project are:

1. To improve the quality of lives of the students attending schools on the reservation,
2. To improve the quality of school health education to meet the needs and interests of the students,
3. To strengthen teaching of health concepts and skills for organizing, evaluating, and using health information and services, and to produce knowledgeable, critical, decision-making, self-directed individuals with a positive self-image, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Health Authority has prepared a questionnaire for parents to assist the Health Authority to develop a health education curriculum for the schools located on the reservation, the answers to which will be kept confidential, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Health Authority has requested Tribal Council approval for the use of the questionnaire and for its form and content, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Health Education Authority Curriculum Project and questionnaire is necessary to develop a health education curriculum for schools located on the reservation and will benefit the health and welfare of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, especially school-age children.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses the philosophy for school health education, the health education curriculum project sponsored by the Health Authority and the questionnaire form developed by the Tribal Health Authority as an aide to carry out the purposes of the Health Education Curriculum Project.


