## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney advises the Tribal Council that the Vocational Skill Center has requested permission to perform the demolition of the Apache Villa building so that their students can utilize the demolition as a course of instruction in construction and demolition, and
- WHEREAS, the Vocational Skill Center requests permission to retain all salvageable materials from the demolition of the building which they will perform at no cost to the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that permission should be granted to the Skill Center for the demolition of the Apache Villa pursuant to the condition that any articles of historical value shall be preserved and delievered at once to the Office of the Tribal Chairman, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney further advises the Tribal Council that certain legal procedures must be completed before the demolition can take place.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to the Vocational Skill Center to perform the demolition of the Apache Villa building pursuant to the conditions set forth in this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby instructs the Tribal Attorney to complete the legal procedures necessary prior to demolition and that upon completion of those proceedings, that he advise the Skill Center so that demolition can commence.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
