RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation was incorporated by the White Mountain Apache Tribe to provide daily radio broadcasting service to the members of the White Mountain Apache Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, to provide this service, KNNB Apache Radio is requesting funding for Apache Radio from February 01, 1984 to April 30, 1984 in the amount of \$29,746.00 to continue radio broadcasting services to the area, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is agreeable to granting the funding request according to the budget attached to this resolution, but only upon the condition that the Radio Station broadcasts are in the Apache language, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council directs that additional hours be set aside for religious programs on Sunday and that the religious services be conducted in the Apache language, and further that all religions be given equal time, including the traditional Apache religion.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request for funding in the amount of \$29,746.00 to cover essential requirements such as staff salaries, basic supplies and utilities in order to insure the operation of the studio and transmitting equipment.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that KNNB Apache Radio Station must comply with the Tribal Council mandate for 100% Apache language broadcast within thirty (30) days of the date of this resolution as a condition to receiving funding as set forth above.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

In reponse to the Tribal Council's request to increase the Apache Language content of our daily programming - the following changes will take effect as soon as possible, subject to approval by the A.R.B.C. Board of Directors:

- 1. All local news broadcasts will be made in the Apache Language i.e. 5 minute spot at 10:00, 11:00, 1:00, 2:00 and 3:00.
- 2. Interviews conducted in English will be accompanied by an Apache translation of important information (summarized).
- 3. All public affairs, station I.D., announcement carts will be produced in Apache or if English is essential, they will be made bilingually (both in English and Apache on same cart).
- 4. Is is (according to the Tribal Government) your responsibility to teach and upgrade the local communities use and appreciation of the Apache language. As a result you must try to improve your Apache speaking ability to the best of your ability.
- All scheduled announcers should be Apache speakers unless there is no Apache speakers available. All efforts must be made to fill schedule with Apache speakers.
- 6. Music and network scheduling will remain unchanged.
