RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to quality behavioral health, social and judicial services for its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is built upon the strengths of its component family units, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that therapeutic counseling services to troubled Apache families will further strengthen the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe further recognizes the need to divert juvenile offenders from the court system when possible and provide them and their families with counseling services, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Child Welfare Act, P.L. 95-608. Title II, provides for the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, to provide such services, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman to negotiate and execute such grants and/or any amendments, and
- WHEREAS, the authority granted under this resolution to the Tribal Chairman is to run concurrent with the term of the grant.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it requests from the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, a grant to the Community Development Corporation to be utilized as applied for by the Families at Risk Program and the Court Diversion Program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grant is to commence on July 1, 1984 and is to be administered through the Community Development Corporation by the Tribal Guidance Center's Families at Risk Program and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Youth Service Center's Court Diversion Program.

The foregoing resolution was on January 12, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
