RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, constituents of Alvino Hawkins and Carlos Nosie of the Seven Mile/East Fork/Turkey Creek District have requested that these Councilmen advise the Tribal Council of the great community need for a temporary bridge at Stago Crossing to replace the temporary structure washed away in the recent flooding, and

WHEREAS, these communities eventually would like a permanent bridge constructed at Stago Crossing for in travel convenience and to enhance fire protection safety for these communities, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after some discussion, agrees that there is a need for the East Fork/Seven Mile/Turkey Creek District to have a temporary bridge constructed across Stago Crossing and requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department meet with the BIA Land Operations, the Fort Apache Timber Company, Alvino Hawkins, and Carlos Nosie for purposes of proposing a plan for the construction of such a bridge adequate to meet the needs of the communities, and for access to their farmlands, for fire protection and other uses.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the BIA Roads Department, BIA Land Operations, a representative from Fatco, Alvino Hawkins, and Carlos Nosie to meet and confer for purposes of proposing a plan for a temporary bridge across Stago Crossing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that subsequent to the meeting between BIA Land Operations, BIA Roads Department, Fatco, and Councilmen, Alvino Hawkins and Carlos Nosie, that they prepare a report for the Tribal Chairman, as to the cost, time frame and the sources of funding, if any is available.

The foregoing resolution was on January 18, 1984, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to

authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (c,h, i, & s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
