

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 83-343 adopted in December, 1983, approved a Right-of-Way for Continental Telephone Company of the West for four repeater and carrier sites in the Carrizo and Cibecue areas, and

WHEREAS, an electrical distribution line will be needed to serve some of these sites, and

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has submitted an Application for Permission to Survey for Right -of-Way for a five-mile single phase 14.4 KV electrical distribution line on Cibecue Mountain.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the application for Permission to survey for Right-of-Way submitted by Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. is hereby approved.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no trees more than 11 inches in diameter shall be cut without permission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby reserves any right they may have against Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. on behalf of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for any damages suffered by the Tribe to trees, fences, livestock, or reseeded as a result of the survey of the aforescribed Right-of-Way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the survey crews shall lop and scatter all brush resulting from the survey in compliance with Bureau of Indian Affairs regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on March 08, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
