RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the frame section of the old hospital located northwest of the main street in Whiteriver is in great danger of collapsing and is a fire hazard; two fires having been set to that section on two recent occasions, and
- WHEREAS, this section of the old hospital may cause injury and present a great fire danger to the remainder of the hospital and any offices or residents who may be working in the hospital or nearby including pedestrians and children, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the frame section of the old hospital should be dismantled as requested by the Tribal Maintenance Department and the Tribal Maintenance Supervisor, Eugene Cosay, Sr.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Maintenance Department to dismantle and tear down the west frame section of the old hospital in order to remove the structural and fire danger now present.

The foregoing resolution was on March 23, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
