- WHEREAS, the Tribal Election of April 04, 1984 for District I, District II District III and District IV commenced with the opening of the polls at 6:00 a.m. and terminated with the closing of the polls at 7:00 p.m., and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Tribal Election Ordinance No. 56 as amended, the Tribal Council assembled in an open meeting the night of the Election, April 04, 1984 and received from the Judges of each precinct, the ballot box or boxes, the unused ballots, rejected ballots, the tally sheets and the abstract of the vote for each precinct, and
- WHEREAS, the abstract of the vote for District Councilmen has been read aloud to the public who convened in the Tribal Council Chambers to observe the counting, and
- WHEREAS, the abstract for each precinct shows that the highest number of votes for District I was received by Mrs. Marjorie Grimes with a total vote of 304, and
- WHEREAS, the abstract for each precinct shows that the highest number of votes for District II was received by Mrs. Gertie Lupe with a total vote of 174, and
- WHEREAS, the abstract for each precinct shows that the highest number of votes for District III was recived by Mr. Alvino Hawkins, Sr. with a total vote of 565, and
- WHEREAS, the abstract for each precinct shows that the highest number of votes for District IV was received by Mr. Herbert Tate with a total vote of 796, and
- WHEREAS, none of the candidates for any of the Districts have contested the final abstract of the total votes cast for each District, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that there is no opposition to the Tribal Council's acceptance of the final total vote for each District or to a declaration by the Council that the candidate who has received the highest number of votes will take his or her respective office in May of 1984 at the regularly scheduled Council Meeting, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council have canvassed the vote and being satisfied that the final abstract and tally for each District is accurate, hereby declares that Mrs. Marjorie Grimes is a new Councilwoman for District I with a total of 305 votes; that Mrs. Gertie Lupe is the new Councilwoman for District II with a total of 174 votes; that Alvino Hawkins, Sr. has retained his seat as Councilman for District III with a total of 565 votes; and that Herbert Tate is the new Councilman for District IV with a total of 796 votes.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares the persons on the final voting abstracts with the highest number of votes as follows:

Marjorie Grimes - District I, Cibecue-Oak Creek-Grasshopper Gertie Lupe - District II, Cedar Creek-Carrizo-Forestdale Alvino Hawkins, Sr.7 District III, East Forl-Seven Mile-Turkey Creek Herbert Tate - District IV, Canyon Day-Whiteriver-North Fork.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that the Tribal Council Members elected present themselves before the Tribal Council during the regularly scheduled May, 1984 Tribal Council Meeting to be sworn in and take their seats on the Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs that the final abstract, tally and minutes of the 1984 Tribal Election be attached to this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

- 9:06 p.m. Cedar Creek Precinct ballot box was delivered by Judge Mary Ann Alexander and William Tenijieth. The results from the final abstract was recorded on the board by Mr. Brown.
- 9:43 p.m. the Canyon Day Precinct Ballot box was delivered to the Board by Judge Lacapa and Joe Burnette and information recorded on the board by Mr. Brown.
- 10:34 p.m. the Cibecue Precinct ballot box was delivered by Judge Lida Thompson to the Board and final abstract information recorded on the board by Mr. Brown.
- 12:30 a.m. the last ballot box from the Whiteriver Precinct containing the precinct and absentee ballots was delivered by Judge Mouser and final abstract results recorded on the board by Mr. Brown.
