

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Audrey Altaha, a tribal member, approached the Tribal Council at its Special Meeting on April 26, 1984, requesting that Resolution No. 84-103, adopted on April 06, 1983 be amended to include her husband, Jimmie Altaha's name on the land assignment, and

WHEREAS, her reason for this amendment is that they have purchased a trailer and in order to place it on the assigned land, both signatures of Mr. and Mrs. Altaha are needed on the resolution to process the documents, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the request for the amendment of the resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request made by Mr. Jimmie Altaha and his wife, Mrs. Audrey Altaha for the amendment of Resolution No. 83-103 to include Jimmie Altaha's name on the assignment of land in the Seven Mile Community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other parts of Resolution No. 84-103 to remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing resolution was on April 26, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
