

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the people of Cibecue must make at least a 90 mile round trip to get banking services; and
- WHEREAS, the people of Cibecue need a place to pay light bills, telephone bills, purchase money orders, cash checks, and receive other banking services; and
- WHEREAS, there is a secure building in Cibecue with a chain link fence available where banking services could be provided.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the Tribe, through the Chairman's office, seek the cooperation of the First Interstate Bank in establishing full or part-time banking services in Cibecue.

The foregoing resolution was on April 26, 1984, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
