RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is eleigible to submit an application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for funding of eligible Indian Community Development Block Grant activities, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has satisfied and will continue to adhere to the requirements of 24 CFR 571.604 concerning citizen participation, as follows:
 - (1) Held an adequately publicized meeting to present information about the Community Development Block Grant Program and allow expression of views; and
 - (2) Followed traditional Tribal means of citizen involvement that meet the standards outlined in Subpart H; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that the replacement of the McNary Sewer System is the highest priority project suitable for this available funding.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman are authorized and directed to sign documents and; otherwise, act to complete a grant agreement with HUD for this purpose.

The foregoing resolution was on May 21, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
