

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Professor Jeff Reid of the University of Arizona, who is in charge of the Grasshopper Summer Archaeological Project in Cibecue, Arizona has come before the Tribal Council with a brief report of the planned activities for the summer and advises the Tribal Council of the fact that he will be employing two tribal members to assist archaeology students at the Grasshopper site, and

WHEREAS, Professor Reid extends an open invitation to the Tribal Council to come visit the students at the Grasshopper site and observe the activities and research ongoing there, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council extends its best wishes to Professor Reid for another summer at the Grasshopper site and thanks him for his invitation and grants its continued approval for the fine archaeological research that is being conducted by Professor Reid and the students at the site.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants its continued approval for Professor Reid to conduct further archaeological studies at the Grasshopper site and welcomes Professor Reid and the students for another summer.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
