## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is informed that the Tribe is eligible to submit an application for a competitive grant award from the Administration for Native Americans, and
- WHEREAS, the redevelopment of the McNary Community has for several years been established as a Tribal priority, and
- WHEREAS, the Hondah area is a key location for future economic development, and
- WHEREAS, both the McNary and Hondah areas require extensive development and renovation of housing, roads, and water and sewer systems before such development can occur, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has previously expressed its desire to assume direct control and responsibility for reservation natural resources, and
- WHEREAS, a detailed study is necessary to determine the feasibility and advisability of assuming these major responsibilities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to submit an application to the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Native Americans for a grant which could be used for the foregoing purposes, and to sign all documents necessary to complete a grant agreement.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
