## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to the delivery of quality Mental Health Services for its tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe is in need of the continuation for such services as have been provided by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638) provides for the Department of Health and Human Services, through the U.S. Indian Health Service, to enter into contract with Tribes to provide such services.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it request from the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service Office, a contract for Fiscal Year 1985, beginning November 1, 1984 aproviding for four (4) staff positions and operational costs for the provision of Mental Health Services. The amount of the request if \$95,180.00.

The foregoing resolution was on July 17, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
