

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Cibecue Community has requested that a Police Officer be assigned to the community from midnight to daybreak in order to provide police protection for the Cibecue people during those hours which presently is not being provided for, and

WHEREAS, the Community of McNary has also requested that an additional Police Officer be stationed at the town to provide additional police protection for the residents of McNary, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after discussing the matter with representatives of the two communities, as well as, the Police Department, concludes that the requests are well-founded, and

WHEREAS, the Police Department explains that there is a shortage of available recruits for the Police Department from tribal members on the reservation despite intensive recruiting efforts, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises the Police Department that the department should look outside the reservation if absolutely necessary in order to ensure proper police protection for the residents of the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Police Department to station Police Officers in Cibecue during the hours from midnight to 6:00 a.m.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it further directs the Police Department to station an additional Police Officer during appropriate hours in the town of McNary in order to provide additional police protection in McNary for the community people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the recommendation to the Police Department that in the event that it is not possible to fully staff the Police Department with tribal members, that the department recruit outside Indian Officers from neighboring reservations until such time as the positions can be filled with qualified members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
