RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority desires to improve the housing situation for Tribal members on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director, Robert Dayaye, has worked with the Phoenix Office of Indian Programs, Department of Housing and Urban Development to obtain the following projects for the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority now requires long term land leases for the following projects:

Project AZ 16-34 Southwest Whiteriver ±30AC	(50 Units)	Rentals
Project AZ 16-36 Southwest Whiteriver ±30AC	(55 Units)	Rentals
Project AZ 16-37 Scattered, Southwest Whiteriver ±60AC	(55 Units)	Mutual Help
Project AZ 16-39 Scattered ±50AC	(50 Units)	Mutual Help
Project AZ 16-40 Scattered ±21AC	(25 Units)	Mutual Help


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has determined that the request leases would be just and in the best interest of the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that approval is hereby given for long-term land leases with the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority for the above listed HUD Projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is authorized and directed to execute all leases and agreements necessary to complete the Project.

The foregoing resolution was on April 23, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
