RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority has been attempting to obtain a backhoe and has not been successful due to the high cost of purchase; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority needs a backhoe to repair septic system failures, sewerline and waterline breaks on the projects; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has a John Deer 710B backhoe available for the Housing Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is willing to accept the cost of repairs and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service requires title documents to be transferred to the Tribe on behalf of the Housing Authority; and


WHEREAS, the Tribe is willing to help the Housing Authority to help the tenants.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby requests that the Indian Health Service transfer the title for the 710B backhoe to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized and directed to sign and complete the documents necessary to effect the transfer of the machine to the Tribe and ensure delivery to the Housing Authority.

The foregoing resolution was on April 23, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
