RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is determined to achieve total economic independence as other governments as soon as possible, and
- WHEREAS, the needs of the community for local governmental services are growing as is the total population and the standard of living of Tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is becoming increasingly dependent on its own resources and abilities to maintain an adequate level of governmental services to the Tribal Community, and
- WHEREAS, there has been a continual and substantial investment of Tribal and other resources in Tribal owned and operated Enterprises that operate in a totally tax-free environment, and many occupy and utilize valuable properties owned by the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Moutnain Apache Tribe that each Enterprise is hereby directed to pay a fee of 1% of its gross receipts to the Central Tribe for the privilege of operating its business on Tribal properties and to help pay for governmental services provided by the Tribe, effective May 1, 1985.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each Enterprise Manager is required to prepare an annual profit plan which will be reviewed at the end of each fiscal quarter year to determine if the Enterprise is performing in conformance to the adopted profit plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each and every Enterprise will: (a) be required to generate a reasonable profit; (b) begin repaying monies invested by the Central Tribe, and (c) contribute to the future economic development of the Tribe and other Enterprises that are started.

The foregoing resolution was on April 25, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 0 against and 5 abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
