RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. Ken Hart, Manager of the White Mountain Apache Enterprise, which is responsible for the administration of the Hawley Lake leases and to some extent, coordinates the removal of Hawley Lake homes from the reservation, has advised the Tribal Council that last summer, unlicensed and unqualified home movers endangered lives and property because they were not fit and proper persons to remove homes and often had inadequate equipment, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hart further explains to the Council that he feels that someone or someone's property, including tribal property may be damaged or injured this summer unless the Tribal Council imposes requirements on the movers prior to being granted permission to come onto the reservation to remove homes whose leases have expired, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hart suggest that the home movers be required to show proof that they are licensed and bonded contractors of the State of Arizona and duly authorized by the State to move homes on State Highways and; further, that they be required to obtain a tribal permit and post a \$2,000.00 cash bond for damage and cleanup, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with Mr. Hart's recommendations.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that henceforth any house movers employed or contracted by any Homeowner at Hawley Lake must:

1. Be licensed and bonded by the State of Arizona and be authorized by the State to move homes on State Highways.
2. Must obtain a Tribal Permit; and,
3. Must post a \$2,000.00 cash bond for damage and cleanup with the Apache Enterprise Manager.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that these requirements shall be effective immediately for the protection, health and safety of tribal members, tribal property and the property of remaining lessees at the Hawley Lake homesites.

The foregoing resolution was on April 25, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
