

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 15, 1985, a copy of which is attached, from the United States Board on Geographic Names to Chairman Ronnie Lupe designating officially the constructed area within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to which the term "Mogollan Rim" pertains, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is utilizing maps which incorrectly designates numerous areas as being "Mogollan Rim", all to the irreparable damage to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, by law the Bureau of Indian Affairs can no longer utilize maps which refer to the "Mogollan Rim" in areas other than that designated by the U. S. Board on Geographic Names.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs must forthwith revise all of its maps to eliminate any reference to "Mogollan Rim" except in the area designated by the Board on Geographic Names and to revise their present maps to comport with the attached copy of the maps prepared by and delivered to the Tribe by the United States Geological Survey and revised by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when new maps are prepared by the Bureau of Indian Affairs that they full comport with the May 15, 1985 letter by the Board on Geographic Names and instructions contained in this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 13, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
