

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Clarinda Bonito, a tribal member, has requested Tribal Council assistance to provide her with hog lumber for her and her family in order to construct a shelter; and

WHEREAS, she explains to the Council that she has nine children with no place or house in which to live and that they are in great need of assistance from the Council to construct a dwelling and shelter before the cold weather sets in; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that this is an emergency request and that hog lumber should be donated for the purpose of constructing a shelter for her family, and further, that the TWEP should be requested to construct this dwelling for her before the cold weather sets in.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Fort Apache Timber Company donate the required hog lumber necessary to construct a dwelling and shelter for Mrs. Bonito and her nine children.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests the Director of the TWEP Program to arrange for the construction of this shelter prior to the advent of cold weather.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
