


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has reviewed the Turkey Creek project proposal for the Reservation's Dwarf Mistletoe Project, and
- WHEREAS, the prevention and suppression of dwarf mistletoe is essential in maintaining the productivity of the Tribe's coniferous stands, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs will continue to utilize the United States Department of Agriculture, United States Forest Service Region 3, Forest Pest Management Pathologist to participate in the development of silvicultural prescriptions used to prevent and suppress dwarf mistletoe, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs will acquire Biological Evaluations prepared by Forest Pest Management for each project proposal, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Tribe, and if necessary other resource experts will develop land use plans for each project proposal which assure the proper management of each Tribal resource, and
- WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee will review and approve each project proposal of the Reservation's Dwarf Mistletoe Project, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs that the prevention and suppression of dwarf mistletoe is essential in maintaining the productivity of the coniferous stands.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Forestry continue with the Reservation's Dwarf Mistletoe Project as attached hereto.

The foregoing resolution was on August 07, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
