

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to provide quality behavioral health, social, and judicial services for its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is built upon the strengths of its component family units, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe maintains that our children are the seeds for the future and as such are held in the utmost regard, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that problems such as child abuse and neglect continues to exist on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe further recognizes the necessity for improved prevention and treatment programs to effectively address the problem of child abuse and neglect, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Economic Security/Administration for Children Youth and Families has received a State appropriation for Fiscal Year 85/86 to develop child abuse and neglect prevention and treatment programs on Indian Reservations, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman, and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman to negotiate and execute such grants and/or any amendments, and
- WHEREAS, the authority granted under this resolution to the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman is to run concurrent with the term of the grant.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it requests from the Arizona Department of Economic Security/Administration for Children, Youth and Families a grant to provide prevention and treatment to the members of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, to be administered by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the grant is to commence October 1, 1985 and ending on June 30, 1986.

The foregoing resolution was on August 07, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
