## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Berlinda Perry, a tribal member, has come before the Tribal Council and requested assistance with her housing situation in McNary, and
- WHEREAS, she explains to the Tribal Council that she is presently paying R77.00 per month for a house which is hardly habitable and requests relief from the payment of rent for such a home, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council assumes that the home is tribal property based upon information it has received from Mrs. Perry and further, concludes that the house should be donated to her because of its condition; thereby, relieving her of the requirement that she pay rent on said house.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby gives all of its rights, title and interest to the home presently being rented by Mrs. Berlinda Perry to her as her and her family's sole property.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Business Manager, with the assistance of the Tribal Attorney's Office, to prepare the necessary documents to transfer the house to Mrs. Perry's ownership.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council, effective this date, that Mrs.

  Perry is hereby relieved of any future rent payments and payment
  on any rent arrearages and that the Tribe is accordingly relieved
  of any maintenance or insurance responsibilities for said house.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
