

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is apparent that over the years Tribal Departments and Enterprises have accumulated property that is no longer useful or necessary to the organization in their daily operations, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is in need of additional cash, and

WHEREAS, this excess property could be liquidated to assist in resolving the cash problem and also remove some unsightly excess equipment.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it authorize L. L. Adams as a broker to work with the individual department managers and Enterprise Managers for this liquidation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each department and enterprise will be given credit for the sale of the excess equipment that the manager has identified for this sale.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
