RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is requested by the Tribal Attorney to authorize an application retroactively for funds in the amount of \$19,800.00 funded by the Criminal Justice Act of 1977 and administered by the Department of Public Safety; said funds to be used for the training of a Victim Witness Advocate Program within the Tribal Court System, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney further advises the Tribal Council that presentation and review of the Tribe's application will be on September 20, 1985 and will be presented in the Offices of the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona by Robert Hershey, the Law Enforcement Legal Advisor for the Tribe and Chief Andrew Kane, his schedule permitting, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney explains to the Tribal Council that there is a great need for a Victim Witness Advocacy training program so that victims and witnesses of crimes can receive proper support and counseling.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes retroactively the application for Criminal Justice Act funds in the amount of \$19,800.00 to be used for a Victim Witness Program in the Tribal Court.

The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Wecretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
