

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Clarinda (Bourke) Bonito, came before the council and advised that recently she requested hog lumber to build a home for her family with the help of Tribal Work Experience Program Carpenter, and

WHEREAS, hog lumber delivered for her house were not suitable and needs some more lumber that could be selected in hog lumber because she is not able to pay for it, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, realizing the need of the family for a decent shelter concludes that more hog lumber be given to Mrs. Bonito and that Mr. Ryan Burnette, Carpenter under the Tribal Work Experience Program be directed to assist the Bonito family in selecting the pieces from hog lumber needed to construct the house.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves more hog lumber for the construction of the house for the Bonito family.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Ryan Burnette, Carpenter, under the Tribal Work Experience Program is hereby directed to meet with the Bonito family and select the lumber needed from hog lumber to construct the home for this family.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Manager of the Fort Apache Timber Company, that assistance be given Mr. Ryan Burnette in selecting lumber needed from hog lumber.

The foregoing resolution was on October 02, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
