

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Northern Arizona University Institute for Human Development has in the past and is currently sponsoring the Whiteriver Infant Stimulation and Preschool Program for handicapped infants and preschool children; and

WHEREAS, the program has previously used a classroom at Headstart but due to the increased enrollment in Headstart, the Headstart facilities are no longer available for the program; and

WHEREAS, Councilman, Lafe Altaha; Headstart Director, Claude Endfield; and Program Coordinator, Diane Lenz, have advised the Tribal Council of the importance of the program and have further requested the use of a classroom at Alchesay Hall to continue the program; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been further advised that a maintained classroom facility is required on a daily basis for 12 months per year for the operation of the program; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the benefits received by the program and the importance to continue its operation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the in-kind contribution of the Alchesay Hall Classroom for the exclusive use of the Whiteriver Infant Stimulation and Preschool Program.


