


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises that pending a resolution of the controversies of the Limestone Sale between the Tribal Council and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, that there may be a shortage of logs for processing in the Cibecue mill which might result in a possible shutdown of the work force at Cibecue, and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid the economic consequences of a log shortage, it is recommended that logs be transferred to the extent necessary from Whiteriver mill to Cibecue mill for processing.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Fort Apache Timber Company immediately haul the necessary number of logs to the Cibecue Sawmill for processing and to the extent necessary to keep the Cibecue mill in full operation and at the present employment rate.

The foregoing resolution was on January 09, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
