

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Manager of the Agriculture Enterprise that the Gleason Flat area contains many acres of fertile ground suitable for the cultivation of certain crops; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it would be beneficial to the Tribe's self-determination, economic self-sufficiency and Agriculture Enterprise if a feasibility study was undertaken for that area.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby proposes that a feasibility study be initiated with the assistance of the Tribe's consultants in regards to the development of the Gleason Flat area for agricultural and other purposes.

The foregoing resolution was on January 23, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
