

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received complaints from residents of the Diamond Creek area that the JTPA Tanning operation produces offensive odors in the community and that the tanning operation should be removed to a non-residential area; and


WHEREAS, it is recommended that the Tanning Operation be given the airport hangar in the airport and that said building should be removed to an isolated area where disposal of its waste products resulting from its operations will not be a problem to the environment.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the JTPA Program to cease their tanning operations in the Diamond Creek area as soon as possible and transfer said operations to an isolated area approved by the Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the JTPA Program may use the vacant airport hangar at the Whiteriver Airport for their tanning operation, but must first move it at JTPA expense to an isolated area approved by the Tribe prior to commencing operations.

The foregoing resolution was on March 11, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
