

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, concerns have been raised that ingress and egress to certain Tribal Operations which are very close to polling precincts may interfere with the voting process during the Tribal Election taking place on April 02, 1986, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, in the interest of promoting a fair and unblemished election, concludes that all Tribal Operations within 200 feet of a polling place should be closed down until the polling place is closed on election day.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that all Tribal Operations within 200 feet of a polling precinct shall be closed down on election day, April 02, 1986 so as to not interfere with the voting process on that day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that attached herto for the benefit of the Tribal Departments and Enterprise Managers is a list of all polling places and that all Executive Managers and Department Heads should make other arrangements to carry on tribal business on election day if ingress and egress to their offices or business premises are within 200 feet of a polling process place.

The foregoing resolution was on March 11, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Tribe May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
