

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Bureau of Indian Affairs Supervisor, Ken Butler rejected three qualified tribal members for the position of Heavy Equipment Operator and now seeks to readvertise that position, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that the Tribal member applicants for the position were experienced and were entitled to veteran's preference, and


WHEREAS, it appears to the Tribal Council that there may have been impropriety and discrimination practiced against the tribal members applying for that position.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Superintendent Russell Bradley of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, forthwith investigate the hiring practices of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Personnel Department and determine if discrimination has been practiced against tribal members; specifically, in respect to the Heavy Equipment Operator position referred to herein.

The foregoing resolution was on March 11, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
