

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, by prior resolution, condemned the actions of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Forestry Engineer, Ken Butler, by his placing a remote automated weather station on Mountain Lion Mountain without prior tribal consent, and

WHEREAS, said resolution requested that Ken Butler be transferred from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for his illegal act, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Superintendent that Mr. Butler states that the Forestry Committee had given its verbal approval to erect a weather station in the Maverick area which has been categorically denied by the Forestry Committee Chairperson, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that an investigation of the circumstances resulting in the construction of a weather station on Mountain Lion Mountain should be initiated by the Tribal Attorney's Office and that a report should be presented to the Tribal Council as to his findings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney to investigate the circumstances surrounding the erection of a remote automated weather station on Mountain Lion Mountain and to report his findings to the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on March 11, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
