

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised of the passage of a walk-thru Resolution Number 86-103, whereby former Tribal Chairman Ronnie Lupe was granted as irrevocable gifts, the desk he used while in office, the 1982 Lincoln assigned to him and the Chairman's Honorarium authorized by prior resolution 83-157; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council after discussion both pro and con in respect to said resolution concludes that the desk and car constitute tribal property and therefore should not be disposed of by gift; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further under the impression that the Chairman's Honorarium is only for past Chairmen who have retired from public life; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further concludes that establishing a precedent whereby tribal property may be given away as a gift would soon become subject to abuse contrary to the interests of the tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes based on the foregoing that Resolution No. 86-103 should be rescinded in its entirety.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby rescinds Resolution No. 86-103 in its entirety.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that the Police Chief of the Whiteriver Police Department secure the 1982 Lincoln now in the possession of former Chairman Ronnie Lupe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 7, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
