

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Superintendent Russell Bradley of the Fort Apache Indian Agency has discussed in detail with the Tribal Council the various funding levels for the Zero Base Budget for the Fort Apache Indian Agency for FY 1988; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that in order to maintain the essential level of personnel and services necessary for the Bureau of Indian Affairs to fulfill its trust obligations to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the Bureau must be funded at a 115% level; and

WHEREAS, any diminution of funding for Fort Apache Indian Agency will result in serious reductions in the quality of services to the tribe and trust performance by the trustee United States.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recommends approval of the Bureau of Indian Affairs' Zero Base Budget for Fiscal Year 1988 at the maximum 115% level.

The foregoing resolution was on May 12, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
