

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Chairman Reno Johnson, Sr., has presented to the Tribal Council for their discussion and consideration, approval of an organizational chart which amongst other goals, proposes to achieve the following:


1. Determines actual responsibilities
2. Defines correct authorities
3. Allows for proper delegation
4. Produce proper lines of communications
5. Places accountability where it belongs


WHEREAS, Chairman Johnson explains to the Council that the Organizational Chart establishes a chain of communication and command for the various tribal enterprises, operations, and departments, and will enhance problem solving and the accountability of Enterprise Managers and Department Heads and will avoid the former situation whereby Boards of Directors and Managers were passed over by direct communication with the Office of the Chairman; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council after a review of the Tribal Organizational Chart agrees with Chairman Johnson's recommendation that the Organizational Chart as depicted be approved and implemented.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the Organizational Chart and implementation thereof in the form presented by Chairman Johnson.

The foregoing resolution was on MAY 15, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
