

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by Mr. David Shadle, Acting General Manager of the Sunrise Resort Complex, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs road project to widen the existing road from the Sunrise service station to the ski area will require the cutting of many trees not useable for sale in the production of lumber; and

WHEREAS, Tribal Resolution Number 81-212 only permits the Sunrise Resort Complex to sell two species of trees cut from the expansion of ski slopes; and

WHEREAS, there are many hundreds of cords of wood to be cut during the road widening project that could be provided gratis to White Mountain Apache Tribal Members, and sold to non-members; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that \$2,000 in sales revenues could be raised to cover the costs of cutting the wood and skidding it to a safe location for sale or distribution; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that it is very desirable to eliminate unsightly roadway views and keep the access road to the Sunrise Resort's ski area as scenic as possible.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves for sale to the non-member general public such wood that is unsaleable as lumbering raw material; and, further approves providing at no cost to tribal members willing to cut and transport at their own expense, any wood remaining in the highway right-of-way shown on location by red flags and stakes with red flags.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the proceeds from this sale will be credited to the Sunrise Resort Complex to cover expenses incurred in cutting, skidding, and selling this wood from the annex parking lot located at the entrance to the ski area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that this resolution has a three month time limit, and that after said period the Sunrise Resort Complex will abide by prior Tribal Resolution Number 81-211.

The foregoing resolution was on June 18, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
